

Let's be Clear with our Waste

Garbage goes in clear bags starting January 1, 2022





Clear Bags for Garbage

Clear Bags for curbside garbage became mandatory on January 1, 2022.

Curbside recycling also became mandatory.

In the first two months, we collected 30-40% more recycling at the curb than the same period for the 5 years previous.

Overall, in 2022 we collected 500 tonnes more curbside recycling than we did in 2021.

Automated Garbage Collection Program

What Is Automated Garbage Collection?

Mechanical arm for garbage collection.

Write your address on the cart



Note: Recycling does not go in cart. There must be 1 metre clearance on all sides of cart and no obstructions above.



Curbside Recycling Program



Place your waste at the curb on your collection day.

In St. John's:

Garbage - Weekly

Recycling - <u>Biweekly</u>
Yard Waste - <u>Biweekly</u>
(Seasonally)

If you live outside of St. John's check with your municipality for your collection schedule.

Yard Waste Collection

Yard waste in paper yard waste bags are collected seasonally on the same day as your recycling day.

INCLUDE:	DO NOT INCLUDE:
Grass	Rocks
Leaves	Logs
Sods	Stumps
Weeds	Lumber
Plant trimmings	Animal Waste
Residual soil/ dirt	Landscape stones/ tiles
Branches (less than 1 inch diameter)	Branches (more than 1 inch diameter)

- No limit to the number of paper yard waste bags
- Composted at the RHB Waste Management Facility
- Used for landscaping purposes

Summary Curbside Collections

- Garbage Collection weekly
- ➤ Automated only what will fit in the cart
- ➤ Non-automated 4 bag limit
- Recycling biweekly
- No limit on number of bags
- Yard Waste biweekly
- No limit on number of bags same day as recycling

On recycling week there will be three different trucks collecting the different materials at the set-out at the curb.



Bulk Garbage/ Metal Collection

We offer curbside collection of bulk garbage and metal items to residents of St. John's once a year.

Before booking an appointment, please go through your intended waste items to determine if they are suitable to be used by someone else. There are many organizations that reuse all kinds of items from furniture to children's toys to lawn mowers, and more. Use our lookup to learn the many options for reuse for your items.

Bulk and metal collection is performed by a private contractor.



Backyard Composting

The City of St. John's, in partnership with the MMSB and MUN Botanical Garden, have a backyard composting program. The program is for St. John's residents only. Participants must complete an online or in-person information session prior to purchasing their compost bin.


- Composting reduces waste going to the landfill

- Specific to Newfoundland, compost bins need to be in a sunny area of your yard







Background Information


- In 2002, the Province released its Provincial Waste Management Strategy
 - Reduce the number of landfills
 - Develop long-term solutions to benefit our environment, communities, and people of the province.
- In May 2007 the Provincial Government announced \$200 million from the Federal Gas Tax Rebate to implement the 2002 Strategy
- In November 2007 the Provincial Government officially designated Robin Hood Bay (RHB) as the site for the Avalon Peninsula's Regional Integrated Waste Management Facility
- The City of St. John's & the Provincial Government committed \$56 million for the Reengineering of RHB into the Regional Integrated Facility
- In October 2010, the City of St. John's implemented a curbside recycling program. Other municipalities/districts in the region have also implemented recycling programs.

Recycling Facility

<u>Dual Stream System Based on Source Separation</u>

- Separate processing lines for:
 - Fibers (paper, cardboard)
- Containers (plastic, metal, aluminum, tetra paks, gable)
- Produces clean, good quality product required for marketing.
- Residual garbage is 6% the lowest in the industry.
 The industry average is 15%.
- ➤ The more material we recycle the longer the life of our landfill saves money for all of us.

Residential Drop-off Facility


Waste sorted into separate types:

- Recycling
- Metals
- > Electronics
- Furniture donation
- > Tires
- Leaves, Grass and Trees (seasonally)
- > HHW

Household Hazardous Waste Facility

- Open Wednesdays & Saturdays: 8am 4pm.
- Materials collected include paint, oil, batteries, household chemicals, CFL light bulbs, etc.
- Located at Residential Drop-Off.

Leachate Reduction & Collection



- Caused by liquid percolating through decomposing waste.
- Leachate is being reduced by:
 - Storm water management systems
 - Installation of an impermeable liner over half the site
- Leachate is treated through the City's sanitary sewer system.



Landfill Gas Collection



- Methane (CH₄) is produced from waste decomposing under anaerobic conditions.
- ➤ Unless captured, CH₄ will vent to the atmosphere.
- CH₄ is an approx. 25x more harmful GHG than CO₂.
- ➤ Flare System reduces RHB's GHGs by an estimated 50,000t.
- > RHB produces an estimated 130,000t of GHG emissions (1.2% of total in NL).
- > RHB has 42 vertical and 3 horizontal extraction wells.
